

Exciting opportunity for young people to become MYAN WA youth consultants

The Multicultural Youth Advocacy Network of Western Australia (MYAN WA) has recently received a grant from the Office of Multicultural Interests (OMI) to develop and deliver training. The grant is auspiced by the Youth Affairs Council of Western Australia (YACWA). This six-month project has two main goals:

1. To increase the cultural competency and cultural intelligence of organisations and services that work with refugee and migrant young people and/or who want to be more accessible to this group
2. To build the skills of young leaders from refugee and migrant background to assist organisation and services to be more culturally aware and inclusive

We are employing a MYAN WA Training Coordinator on a six-month contract to develop and deliver this training, but we are also looking for up to **six passionate youth consultants** to co-design and co-deliver the two training packages.

Your role

Your role will be to work with the MYAN WA Training Coordinator to develop training content for one of the training packages, and to be trained to co-deliver both of the training packages. The role will involve up to 50 hours of work from mid-August 2018 to early February 2019. There are three main components to the role:

1. Attending and contributing to planning meetings where you will work together and with the Training Coordinator to design training
2. Learning the training content and becoming practiced and skilled at delivering components of the training
3. Co-delivering parts of the training packages (in collaboration with the Training Coordinator and other young people)

Eligibility

To be eligible, you must:

- Be aged 16 to 25
- Be from a refugee OR migrant background
- Have excellent communication and public speaking skills
- Be keen to contribute your experience as a refugee or migrant young person to the development of the training

All planning meetings will be held in Leederville. The training that you will help deliver will be in other locations in the Perth metropolitan area, and one in a regional area. We will assist with transport if required.

Reimbursement

This is a paid role. You will be employed by YACWA on a casual basis to work up to 50 hours at a SCHADS level 1.1 - \$25.73 per hour. You will submit fortnightly time-sheets.
